

It's time for An Evening for Autism

The second annual event, which takes place in Newport Beach, aims to expand programs for children with autism.

Barry Saywitz, president of The Saywitz Co., whose four-year-old son lives with the disease, is the brains behind An Evening for Autism.

Proceeds from ticket sales and the silent and live auction will go toward Easter Seals, a nonprofit based in Illinois, Talk About Curing Autism in Costa Mesa, the Newport Mesa School District and Autism Society of America to raise funds that will provide in-school and after-school services for children with special needs. Each organization will receive 25 percent of the total.

Saywitz hopes to raise more than \$250,000 and expects more than 500 guests at the event, which will be held at his Newport Beach home on Saturday.

The tropical-themed event will feature food tastings from Orange County restaurants such as Tommy Bahama's Island Grill, The Beach Pit BBQ and Newport Rib Co.; three live bands; and hostesses from the Miss California Beauty Pageant and San Diego Charger Cheerleaders.

Tickets cost \$150 and come with a 10 percent discount at the Tommy Bahama retailer in Corona del Mar or at Tommy Bahama's Island Grill.
